- r. The Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Steering Committee- Ruth Doxsee- **The Meeting was last** night. Jonah Glickman was there from Nury Martinez's office. They were unable to do the controlled burn due to a burrowing owl being spotted. They will try again in May or June. They are continuing maintenance on paths, viewing areas, and signage. One of the homeless people tampered with the outflow of the lake and the lake level has now gone down several feet. It caused erosion and problems for the wildlife. In late September an arson suspect was arrested. They were unable to get him for arson but they got him for having a meat cleaver. They are working on removing the three homeless encampments from the wild life area. Ms. Doxsee reported there were larger numbers of Monarch butterflies this year in La County.

Guest Speaker: California Assembly Member Adrin Nazarian representing the 46th District: The Assembly-member has been Chief of Staff to Paul Krekorian and served as an aide to Brad Sherman and has been a great friend to Lake Balboa Neighborhood Council. Prior to COVID19, he hosted the High School Chess Tournament to which LBNC added the Grade School Tournament which led to the addition of chess tables at Lake Balboa and Louise Parks. Assembly-member Nazarian has been dealing with the Pandemic for the last year and a half. There has been economic loss, mental health issues, fires, an on-going homeless crisis, and food insecurities. Housing market- It has been like Whack- a-Mole trying to stop the leaks in the dam. He has been working on aging and long- term care infrastructure. (Water and Transportation) and seismic Issues. To minimize injuries and death. The State is dealing with economic job loss and a hit to the market. He is very concerned with the most vulnerable people. They live in the most vulnerable housing. On the education front- children's savings 529 accounts are being set up by the State of California for educational investment, whether it is university or trade schools, it helps to enhance student career opportunities. They had originally offered a pilot program for the school districts but only districts with money could afford to do it. Last year they saw that the budget might be better than it was expected to be. They began starting accounts with \$25.00 to help start the accounts with incentives so that more money can be earned. The Governor invested 50 Million in this program initially. This year a \$180 Million Dollar investment will be ongoing and a \$2 Billion Dollar one-time investment will help build the program. COURT-APPROVED RULES OF DECORUM

A municipality need not reinvent the wheel when adopting rules of decorum for its meetings. Sixteen years ago, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals upheld the validity of the following ordinance in the landmark case of White v. City of Norwalk:

Each person who addresses the council shall not make personal, impertinent, slanderous or profane remarks to any member of the council, staff or general public. Any person who makes such remarks, or who utters loud, threatening, personal or abusive language, or engages in any other disorderly conduct which disrupts, disturbs or otherwise impedes the orderly conduct of any council meeting shall, at the discretion of the presiding officer or a majority of the council, be barred from further audience before the council during that meeting.

Norwalk had construed the ordinance as allowing ejection only if a person's speech actually disrupted, disturbed or otherwise impeded the meeting. Based on that narrow interpretation, the court ruled that the ordinance was not too vague or overbroad in scope.

Below are some key highlights that we should be aware of. I have also attached the full text in PDF format. Would love your thoughts.

Response to Public Comments: Announcements. Members of the legislative body or its staff may briefly respond to statements made or questions posed by persons exercising their public testimony rights under Government Code section 54954.3. Members of the legislative body or its staff may also make a brief announcement, make a brief report on his or her own activities, ask a question for clarification, provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information, or request staff to report back to the legislative body at a subsequent meeting concerning any matter. The legislative body or any of its members may also direct staff to place a matter of business on a future agenda.

(Government Code §§ 54954.2, 54954.3, 54956, 54956.5.)"

Ability to Impose Reasonable Time Limits on Public Comment. In September 2018, a California appellate court reaffirmed the ability of the agency's governing body to impose reasonable time limits on public comment during a meeting. (Ribakoff v. City of Long Beach (2018) 27 Cal.App.5th 150.). The case evaluates both the Brown Act and the First Amendment to the United State Constitution, and contains an excellent discussion on the limitations a governing body of a public entity can impose on public comments during meetings.

The court recognized that while legislative body meetings are open to the public, they are still governmental processes with an agenda and a purpose. Therefore, limitations for the purposes of keeping the legislative body meeting on schedule and an topic are justified.

purposes of keeping the legislative body meeting on schedule and on topic are justified. Important points from the case include the following:

• Legislative bodies are generally not permitted to adopt rules that limit public comment based on the content of the comment. But it is not a free speech violation to limit comments to the topic at hand.

• Cities or other entities with police power may adopt ordinances that authorize penalties for members of the public when their behavior, rather than the content of their expression, impairs the conduct of the meeting.

· Legislative bodies may adopt reasonable time limitations on public comment.

• Legislative bodies may have different time limitations for public comment versus staff and invited speakers.

FINALIZATION OF BOARD ACTION:

Per City Charter Section 245, the Board's determination shall become final at the expiration of the next five meeting days of the Council during which the City Council has convened in regular session, unless the City Council acts within that timeframe by a two-thirds vote to bring the action before them or to waive review of the action.
