

Beginning with the organization's sixth taxable year and all succeeding years, it must meet one of the public support tests under section 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) or section 509(a)(2) as reported on Schedule A of the Form 990. - **A.** *Meeting Code of Conduct All Attendees, Stakeholders and Members of the Community must be speak and act in a respectful and civil manner.*
 - 1. When speaking in regards to agenda items, discussion must be limited to the topic at hand and specific to the agenda item.
 - 2. The use of profanity, threats of violence or other acts that are inappropriate in civil discussion and public meeting will not be tolerated.
 - 3. At the discretion of the Board President or Committee Chair, a violation of the Meeting Code of Conduct may result in temporary or permanent ban from speaking at that meeting. Continued violations during subsequent meetings may result in you not being allowed to speak at future public meetings held by LBNC.
 - 4. All speakers will adhere to the time limit specified for either Public Comment or Discussion on Agenda Item as specified and directed by the Time Keeper and or the Board President.
