In addition, the LBNC would prefer that cleared areas be deeply mulched to retard regrowth of the weeds. Funding would possibly be to organizations similar to and/or including the Los Angeles Conservation Corps

LBNC further requests that LA city council authorize the carry over funds from the Fiscal Year 2023/2024 budget to be held for this project.






