Arturo Gonzales-He is here representing Jacobs a company doing outreach. \$500 million dollars has been given by the city to redo the Tillman Reclamation Plant which processes 40 million gallons of water a day. The city has four water reclamation plants including Hyperion which processes 500 million gallons a day. The upgrade to the Tillman Plant will process the water to the Tertiary Stage where it will be pumped to the spreading grounds and used later.
 - b. Ernie- spoke about Muralism, they paint murals. They have painted 70 murals so far and have a goal of 100 before the Olympics. They can help Neighborhood Councils through the process.
