#### 5. Multiple Programs

#### a. October 12, 2019 Valley Disaster Fair Review – Bill Hopkins

The Saturday Fair was preceded on Thursday by large wildfires, evacuations, and highway/road closures. The Salvation Army was deployed and not available for food service. The Fire Department was absent and working the fires. Some exhibitors were not available, but there were many good displays.

Approximately 4,000 people attended. Free family EP kits were distributed. Although air quality had improved, N95 dust masks were made available to those attending.

Michelle Dornfest reported that featured speakers LAPD Chief Michael Moore, and Diana & William of C.E.M. P. were able to attend; excellent speakers, and TV coverage.

#### b. EP Emergency Evacuation Binder – Linda Pruett

An example of an Emergency Go Binder was displayed passed around to attendees for viewing. Templates for binder pages can be printed at home. Go to: <u>www.foodstoragemoms.com</u> and scroll down to the emergency binder pages. Make a great tool having important information needed in case of disaster or evacuation.

### c. Brent's Box – Brent Lowensohn

Attendees were given the opportunity to review his newly-patented item. This is a system to help in emergencies. It is an Emergency Response Kit Box. This 'box' has sub-container module boxes. Each module is identifiable: ICS, Operations, Logistics, Planning, and Administration. Vest, cards, action instructions, and an Organization Chart are included. A multipage detailed booklet was distributed for review. Funding and marketing of this item is still needed, as well as for fabrication and distribution. Discussion followed. The feedback was positive.

#### d. EP Items for the Holidays – Jeff Edelstein, SOS Survival Store

Jeff brought several items to consider for gift giving: pet kits, collapsible water bowels, car leash, pre-made EP kits (about \$25), Zombie kits (starting at \$40) solar panel Biolite 5 and portable charger. Stocking stuffer ideas: window break/seat belt cutter, radio, storage bags (\$6-7), energy bars (\$1.00 ea.), Power zone Bright Light (\$40), and dust masks.

Emergency preparedness classes make great gifts for the holidays. Update food and water supplies annually.

Text 888777 to sign up for alerts in order to be prepared to evacuate. A SOS gift guide and evacuation check list were distributed. The 19<sup>th</sup> Annual SOS Parking Lot Sale is scheduled for April 24 and 25, 2020.

6. Remember the Animals - Operation Blankets of Love. Linda Pruett reminded the group to bring contributions of clean/new blankets and towels for dogs and cats in the Shelters, and also for pets owned by the Homeless. Other needed items: collars, leashes, food and treats, stainless steel food bowls, crates, igloos, carriers, and other cat and dog related items.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:52 AM.
