- 7. Land Use: Tesla Motorcars. Steve Leffert. Discussion on the proposed automobile service and repair sop for electric vehicles only at 6919-21 Hayvenhurst Ave. the space is currently being used for deliveries only. Stakeholders concerned with some safety issues that were addressed by Tesla and Leffert. This will be the first of several locations to open in Los Angeles. Leffert made the following motion: "I move that the LBNC write a letter to the L.A.City Planning Department in support of the Conditional Use Permit and Zoning Variance to allow Tesla Motors to operate an electric automobile repair and service center at 6919-21 Hayvenhurst Ave., Lake Balboa, CA 91406 (Case ZA 2013-754 (CU)(ZV). Furthermore, the LBNC urge the Planning Department to accept the Mitigated Negative Declaration (ENV-2013-755-MND). The LBNC also stipulates that it would like to Tesla facility named the Tesla Lake Balboa Service Center." Mike Rosa seconded the motion. Vote: (13-0) Motion passes.

Vote: (12-0) Motion passes. The funds allocation request for the Valley Disaster Preparedness Fair was withdrawn, and will be introduced in the FY2013-

2014.

- **14. Outreach/Schools. Nelson.** Motion to allocate up to \$200 for Magnolia Science Academy Sign with LBNC URL on it. Steve Leffert seconded the motion. Vote: (12-0) Motion passes.
- **15. Outreach. L.Schwering.** Motion to allocate up to \$450 to the purchase of LBNC logo embroidered shirts for board members to wear as an outreach and identification tool at meetings, events, and gatherings by Linda Schwering, Mike Rosa seconded. Vote: (11-0-1) Motion passes.
- **16. Outreach. Tessier.** Motion to by Brian Tessier to allocate up to \$1300 (for 288 outreach T-shirts silk-screened with I Heart Lake Balboa on the front, and the LBNC logo and URL on the back for clean-ups and NC events), up to \$350 for one adjustable (6ft to 8ft) event table cover, and up to \$100 for handouts at outreach events. Allen Nelson seconded the motion. Vote: (10-0-2) Motion passes.
