President Linda Gravani explained some of the context and history of Item 5 on the Agenda. The Plan for Neighborhood Councils was originally approved May 30, 2001 and last amended in 2013. Years ago, the Neighborhood Council Review Commission began reviewing the function and operation of Neighborhood Councils. It completed its work in 2007. Some of the recommendations were never put into operation, and some are similar to what Councilman Ryu has now recommended. Ms. Gravani handed out the Executive Summary of that Commission's recommendations. The Council File for that project was CF05-0894-S3.

3. Adoption of the Agenda August 19, 2018

4. PUBLIC COMMENT

Linda Pruett stated that on August 25, 2018, from 4 to 7 p.m., at the Del Taco on Balboa at Vanowen, 20% of purchases will be given to the SoCal Preparedness Foundation, which is behind on funding this year. She urged everyone to support the Foundation by participating in that fundraising activity.

5. Discussion and possible action regarding CF18-0467 – Neighborhood Council System Reforms – Reconsidering 5.1, 5.2 from 8.1.18 (#24.1 #24.2) LBNC Meeting¹ - Gravani

(1) Recommendations and next steps for amending City Charter Article IX to change the name of the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) to the Neighborhood Councils Department (NCD), the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC) to the Neighborhood Councils Commission (NCC), and phasing out the use of the term/branding 'Empower LA' due to the confusion reported by the public and the perception of Neighborhood Council members that DONE's role should be primarily to support Neighborhood Councils, which the name Neighborhood Councils Department would better reflect.

This item, which was voted on at the August 1, 2018 Board Meeting, was reconsidered. Carol Newman brought a motion to amend the City Charter Article IX as proposed, seconded by James Brown.

(2) Recommendations and next steps for amending the Los Angeles Administrative Code to remove the "Community Impact Stakeholder," which has caused substantial confusion and disputed elections, and recommendations and next steps for including specific additional definitions by ordinance of eligible voters and board members of Neighborhood Councils, such as student or parent/guardian of a student.

This item, which was voted on at the August 1, 2018 Board Meeting, was reconsidered. Carol Newman brought a motion in favor of the proposal to remove "Community Impact [Interest] Stakeholder," seconded by James Brown. Considerable discussion followed.

Neighborhood Council "selection" processes are utilized by a limited and decreasing number of councils and are not viewed by the public as being as democratic as elections as they do not provide for a secret ballot or equitable participation. Linda Gravani brought a motion to OPPOSE amending City Charter Article IX to remove any reference to "selections," seconded by James Brown.

Linda Pruett brought a motion to OPPOSE creating this one-time review process, seconded by Sandy Joseph.
