8. Guest Speaker: Barbara Hatley Employee at West Valley Animal Shelter. Discussion and possible action regarding CF20-1114 - Motion brought to City Council on 9/2/2020 and as of 10/26/2020 – 5 NCs forwarded Community Impact Statements (CIS) AND 259 public comments were in favor of permanent operation of the West Valley Animal Shelter. Ms. Hatley is a 30- year Employee. The Shelter was closed due to Covid -19. The West Valley Shelter has remained closed and is causing problems for the other shelters. There are no adoptions and no enforcement coming from the West Valley. The West Valley Shelter is the only Shelter with air conditioning. We need to have a fully functional Municipal Shelter at that site. That is what the taxpayers paid for in Proposition F. This is a Public Safety Issue. It can take a few hours to get a response for animal attacks. The City offered a retirement incentive. Only 3 Officers are leaving. There are 9 currently training. There is enough staff. Ms. Gravani read the following: In response to the City's current financial situation it has come to the Councils attention that the once temporary plan to shutter city operations at the West Valley Animal Shelter could become permanent it is imperative that the City maintain it's operation at the West Valley Animal Shelter. I therefore move that the Department of Animal Services be instructed to report immediately to this Council on the long-term plan for the West Valley Animal Shelter.

Public Comment: Stacey Rotter- Q/Serious concerns. Has it made it to the Mayor and has he addressed it? A horse is being held as evidence in a dog play yard at East Valley. A/ He wants to see her plan before he comments on it. Michelle Cornelius- Volunteer at West Valley Animal Shelter has the Prop F Brochure. There was over crowding which is why they were built. Two shelters have been given away already and they do not provide city services.

9. GUEST SPEAKER on WEST NILE VIRUS and other mosquito-transmitted diseases, presented by: Wesley Collins, Supervisor of Operations, Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District. wcollins@glacvcd.org 818-364-9589 The recording is on the LBNC Website. Mr. Collins spoke about how they serve about 6 million people in the District. They check yards and flood control channels and respond to requests. They do education for the public. There is an uptick in mosquito complaints and West Nile virus. West Nile virus is tracked by zip code. They talked about the life cycles of the different mosquitoes. The New Aedes mosquito (invasive) bites around the clock and like to live inside. They leave large welts and swelling for many people when they bite. They reproduce by laying eggs in containers and dirt and will hatch up to years

later when they get wet. They carry different diseases like Zika, Dengue, and Yellow Fever. The common household mosquito spreads West Nile virus. They lay their eggs in water. These mosquitoes bites around dawn and dusk. There is a lot of information on their website that explains all of the information that was presented. The Department traps and tests the insects and the ways they use to kill them. They investigate service requests when they receive reports. Remove standing water. Don't use trays under your plants. Repellant may be necessary. There is a list of active ingredients recommended by the CDC on their website. Theresa- Stakeholder Q/Do they still come out? A/ You need to generate a service request.

They met with the Mayor on October 9, 2020. The City is in a financial crisis. They approved big raises to first responders. The Budget will be short about 600 million this year. They will likely have to lay-off employees and do furloughs. The City Leaders need to pay attention. There will be a Town Hall in the near future. New website-www.budget advocates.com.

- c. Health & Public Safety- James Brown- A Public Safety Meeting was held on October 17, 2020. The Highlights of the meeting were what LAPD has been doing since the funding realignment. LAPD is more than happy to hand off some of its responsibilities that they had been called upon to handle which should be dispersed to other agencies like Health and the mentally ill. Currently there are two million people in the San Fernando Valley and only 2,000 officers. Our Public Safety Committee is messaging out that "Public Safety is everyone's business." The Police only know what is happening in your community if you let them know. File reports. Do not post on Next Door and give the criminals a heads up in advance of the Police addressing the issue. Response times will be slower. Saturday November 21, 2020 will be the next Public Safety Meeting at 10:00AM on Zoom.

- g. Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Areas Steering Committee (SBWASC) Ruth Doxsee/Danica Middleton- This was a special meeting held because of the devastating fire and wildlife lake's infestation by water lettuce, which, if not dealt with, will kill the lake. After the September 6, 2020 fire, invasive weeds have been burned to the ground, but will return with rain. To control these, hiring goats with a taste for invasive plants is being considered. It is \$500 per day for 100 goats to clear one acre. It will take 100 goats 4-6 weeks in April through end of May to control the invasive plants. This will cost \$15,000. Please keep this in mind when we are asked to help fund the restoration of the Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Reserve. Invasive Water Lettuce: Oct. 27 saw 30 city employees in boats and on shore remove an entire 10 yd. dump truck of the water lettuce from the wildlife lake. Previously, volunteers were doing "teaspoon sized" removal of it. A screen is in place to keep it from entering the LA River. Parks and Rec is keeping an eye on it and will investigate spraying with herbicide when its growth picks up again in the spring. Unfortunately, it will probably take a few years to bring under control fully and hopefully eradicate.
