Being a board member is a great way to get involved in community services and needs, and gives you direct access to city officials, council members and law enforcement working in our neighborhood. If you want to make a difference, please consider joining the Lake Balboa Neighborhood Council Board. There are currently several vacant positions on our Board. One vacancy is a Business seat. To qualify you must own a business or business rental property or real property; or work within The Council's boundaries. There are also two At Large seats. To qualify for this appointment, a) your primary residence or living space must be within the boundaries of the Lake Balboa Neighborhood Council, or b) you must own a business or business rental property or real property; or work within The Council's boundaries or c) you must participate in a religious institution, educational institution, community organization, non-profit organization, neighborhood association, school/parent group, faith based group, senior group, youth group, arts association, service organization, boys and girls club, cultural group, or environmental group within the Council's boundaries.

There is also one Youth Representative seat. To qualify you must qualify under the either standard above AND be between the ages of 14 and 17. Persons appointed will hold the board seats until the regular elections are held in the Spring of 2014.

For consideration for appointment to these board vacancies, please submit a written application to the board via email on website, www.lakebalboanc.org. The board will vote on the applications as an agenda item at the December 7th regular board meeting. Consider taking action in your own community!

NEIGHBORHOOD Advisory WARNING! From West Valley Police There is a potential residential burglary problem in this area. A recent spike of burglary in this area and is a reminder that there is a history of spikes burglaries throughout the last several years. The area is attractive to burglars, as many residents in the area I are in their later years and all of us often times forget to secure windows or doors prior to leaving the house. The bathroom window is the most often entered as many leave it open for ventilation during the morning. As with most all residential burglaries, those in this area occur during the working hours and work days. Most burglars do not want to be seen or confronted. Sometimes a suspect would knock on the door pretending to look for dog or some other excuse to check if someone is home. If nobody answers the door they will often go to the side/rear and find a way in. If you are home and in doubt of anyone's true identity, talk to them through the door don't open it! IF they seem suspicious, call the police and wait. You are not bothering us. Be vigilant! Help us help you. Please consider joining an existing or starting a new neighborhood watch program in your neighborhood.
