Runoff for CD6 - July 23



Former State Assemblymember Cindy Montañez will face LAUSD School Board member Nury Martinez in a July 23 runoff for the City Council seat to represent us in Council

District 6.

Front-runner Cindy Montanez garnered 44.53 percent of votes by early Wednesday morning, but fell short of the majority needed to clinch the race. A majority is required for election. Martinez garnered 23.93 percent.

Rounding out the contest were student Walter Escobar, businessman Richard Valdez, senior government advisor Derek Waleko, and community activist and businessman J. Roy Garcia, according to the Daily News.

The winner of the contest will finish the two remaining years of Cardenas' term. He was elected to congress in 2012.

Prop D Passes

Many of our Lake Balboa Stakeholders have come to the Neighborhood Council Board meetings and



expressed their frustration over the abundance of the Medical Marijuana shops that have sprung up in our neighborhood.

Proposition D, which limits the number of

marijuana shops in the city—<u>passed with 63 percent of the vote</u>. Prop D will cap the number of pot shops at 135 and also raise taxes and limit hours of operation.

Two other medical marijuana proposals were also on the ballot: Ordinance E would have also capped the number of clinics at 135 but without new taxes. Supporters chose to back Prop D instead, leaving Prop E to fail with 35 percent.

Ordinance F wouldn't have limited the number of clinics, but would have put in place tougher controls, such as audits and testing for pesticides and toxins. But it failed with only 40 percent of the vote.
